Now, therefore, I, Scott M. Matheson, Governor of the State of Utah, upon recommendation of the State Engineer and pursuant to Section 73-6-2, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended, do hereby restore to the public the right to appropriate the surplus and unappropriated water from the Sevier River and its tributaries for non-consumptive purposes. Except as modified herein and by the Proclamation of June 5, 1951, the Withdrawal of December 19, 1946, shall remain in full force and effect.

This Proclamation shall become effective upon completion of publication of notice hereof once a week for three successive weeks in newspapers of general circulation within the Sevier River Drainage Basin. After the first publication of said notice, applications may be deposited with the State Engineer and at the time such Proclamation becomes effective, the State Engineer shall hold public hearings giving all applicants notice to determine which applications so filed during the period of publication are in most conducive to the public good, and shall file such applications in order of priority according to such determination.
