Gentlemen: RE: RESTORATION PROCLAMATION - GREEN RIVER

By Restoration Proclamation, George D. Clyde, Governor of the State of Utah, did restore to the public the right to appropriate the surplus and unappropriated water, for any and all lawful purposes, the water of the Green River in Daggett and Uintah Counties.

Said Restoration Proclamation was officially published in the Deseret News, Salt Lake City, Utah, on August 7, 14, 21, 1958, in accordance with the Restoration Proclamation Statute Section 73-6-2, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, Laws of Utah, which reads in part as follows:

"~~\*\*\*\*~~ Applications for appropriations shall not be filed during the time such waters are withdrawn from appropriation; provided, that after the first publication of notice aforesaid applications may be deposited with the state engineer and at the time such proclamation becomes effective the engineer shall hold public hearings, giving all applicants notice, to determine which applications so filed during the period of publication of such notice are most conducive to the public good, and shall file such applications in order of priority according to such determination."

Applications were filed only by the Bureau of Reclamation and by the Utah Water and Power Board during this publication period.

This is to notify you that in accordance with said statute that a public hearing will be held in the office of the State Engineer, 403 State Capitol, Salt Lake City, Utah, at 9 A.M., Friday, September 19, 1958, to consider the priority of applications so deposited during the publication of such notice as required.

This is to advise that of the 42 applications filed by the Utah Water and Power Board, 16 of them were not subject to the Proclamation as they propose to appropriate 5 sec.-ft. or less, or propose to appropriate in counties other than Daggett or Uintah. The withdrawal Proclamation covered only the Green River in Daggett and Uintah Counties, but allowed the filings of applications for 5 sec.-ft., or less, for any one project.
