NOTICE TO WATER USERS

Notice is hereby given of the following Reclamation Proclamation of the drainage area of the Bear River and its tributaries, the official publication of which information being found in the issues of the Deseret News, Logan City, Utah: October 1, 1955

RESTORATION OF PROCLAMATION BEAR RIVER, SUMMIT, RICH, CACHE AND BOX ELDER COUNTIES

Whereas, in order to preserve the surplus unappropriated water of the Bear River and its tributaries for use by irrigation districts and organized agricultural water users and for other beneficial purposes of appropriation of such source was heretofore suspended by Proclamation of the Governor of the State of Utah under date of November 9, 1938, pursuant to Section 73-1, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1933, as amended by Chapter 208, Laws of Utah, 1937, now Section 73-1, Utah Code Annotated, 1953

Whereas, said suspension has been restored by Proclamation dated April 2, 1949, and June 1, 1950, it appears that the public to appropriate ground sources within the area of the Bear River has not been properly or legally suspended and was never intended to be suspended, and

Whereas, there is no need for further suspension of the right of appropriation of the water of Bear River and all its tributaries and sources and the State Engineer has recommended that the right of appropriation be restored.

Now, therefore, I, J. Bracken Lee, Governor of the State of Utah, upon the recommendation of the State Engineer and pursuant to and by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Utah by Section 73-6-2, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, do hereby restore to the public the right of appropriate the surplus and unappropriated water for any and all lawful purposes within the drainage area of the Bear River and all its tributaries and sources, both surface and underground in Summit, Rich, Cache and Box Elder Counties in Utah.
