

BY THE GOVERNOR OF UTAH

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Herbert B. Maw, Governor of the State of Utah, did on the 19th day of December, 1946, issue a proclamation withdrawing from appropriation the surplus and unappropriated waters of the Sevier River and,

WHEREAS, Six Mile Creek in Sanpete County, is a tributary of the Sevier River and,

WHEREAS, the State Engineer has recommended that the right of appropriation for power purposes be restored on the said Six Mile Creek,

Now, therefore, I, J. Bracken Lee, Governor of the State of Utah, upon recommendation of the State Engineer and pursuant to and by virtue of authority vested in the Governor of the State of Utah by Section 100-8-2, Utah Code Annotated, 1943, hereby restore to appropriation for power purposes the surplus and unappropriated water of the said Six Mile Creek. That part of the proclamation withdrawing from appropriation for power purposes the water of such source is hereby revoked and annulled.

This proclamation shall not become effective until notice thereof has been published at least once a week for three successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the county in which the source is located, as provided by law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Utah. Done at the State Capitol in Salt Lake City, Utah, this fifth day of June, 1951.
