

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF UTAH

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation dated November 9, 1938, the Governor of the State of Utah, temporarily suspended the right of the public to appropriate the surplus or unappropriated water from the following sources:

(copy from Proclamation dated Nov. 9, 1938)

and

WHEREAS, the State Engineer of the State of Utah has recommended that the right of the public to appropriate small quantities of water from such sources for domestic and culinary use be restored, and it appearing that the public interest will be served by such partial restoration,

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED AND PROCLAIMED that pursuant to Section 100-8-2, Utah Code Annotated, 1943, the right of the public to appropriate for domestic and culinary use water from the sources described above by applications for appropriation of not exceeding two second feet of water for any one project, is hereby restored, provided, however, that this proclamation shall not become effective until notice thereof has been published at least once a week for three successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the boundaries of said river systems or other water sources, as provided by law.
