

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF UTAH

A PROCLAMATION

I, Herbert E. Maw, Governor of the State of Utah, upon written recommendation of the State Engineer and pursuant to and by virtue of the authority in me vested by Section 100-8-2, Utah Code Annotated 1943, do hereby restore to public appropriation the following waters and watersheds, to-wit:

That portion of the Provo River between Deer Creek dam and the mouth of the river.

This Proclamation shall become effective upon completion of its publication as prescribed by law. The publication shall be for three successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the boundary of the water source described above; provided, however, that after the first publication of notice of this Proclamation, applications to appropriate waters within said restored area may be deposited with the State Engineer, and the State Engineer may hold public hearings to determine which applications so filed within the period of publication of notice of restoration are most conducive to the public good, and the State Engineer may file such applications and fix their priorities in accordance with such determination.
