MEMORANDUM: WITHDRAWAL OF WATER FROM APPROPRIATION.

Bear River

Withdrawn during the period June 30 to October 20, 1928. On November 9, 1938, the following proclamation withdrew the water of the Bear River and tributaries from appropriation:

"BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF UTAH

A P R O C L A M A T I O N

In order to preserve the unappropriated and surplus water of the sources hereinafter described, for use by irrigation districts and organized agricultural water users, and in the interest of the welfare of the State of Utah, I, HENRY H. BLOOD, Governor of the State of Utah, upon the recommendation of the State Engineer and pursuant to and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 100-8-1, Revised Statutes of Utah, 1933, as amended by Chapter 130, Laws of Utah, 1937, do hereby temporarily suspend the right of the public to appropriate the surplus or unappropriated waters of the following sources:

That portion of the Bear River located in Rich, Summit, Cache, and Box Elder Counties, Utah:

The following tributaries of the Bear River in Summit County:-

Stillwater Fork, Hayden Fork, East Fork, Mill Creek, West Fork, Yellow Creek, and tributaries thereto, immediate and remote;

Bear Lake and the following tributaries to Bear River in Rich County:-

Duck Creek, Dry Creek, Dry Hollow Creek, Salaratus Creek, Woodruff Creek, Big Creek, Randolph Creek, Otter Creek, Bridger Creek, Sage Creek, Duck Creek, Twin Creek, Sixmile Creek, Rabbit Creek, South Lake Creek, Spring Creek, and tributaries thereto, immediate and remote;

The following tributaries to Bear River in Cache County:-

Cub River, High Creek, Cherry Creek, City Creek, Nebo Creek, Smithfield (Summit) Creek, Hopkins Slough, Birch Creek, Hyde Park Creek, Green Creek, Logan River, Little Bear River,
