Whenever the waters of Bullion Creek or Beaver
Creek, Piute County, are more than are decreed herein as
belonging to the users thereof, taking the same above the
lowest dam in each of said creeks, and there is an excess
flowing over said dams, or either thereof, and such excess
is insufficient to reach the Sevier River, such excess may,
under the direction of the Water Commissioner, be taken
and used by said owners of water taking the same above
said dam or dams.

The primary rights, hereinbefore set out in Sections A,
B, C, D, are independent rights as between said sections.
The second-class rights hereinbefore set out in Sections B,
C, and D shall not be distributed or used at any time when
the primary or second-class rights of said Section A are
not filled.
