

Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 5 West; (2) 1469 feet North and 816 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into unnamed ditches and used to irrigate the land above described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that William Penny, E. H. Mortensen, and Dennis B. Manhard are entitled to the use of 4 c.f.s. of the waters of Little Cottonwood Creek, with priority date as of 1890. Said water to be diverted from Little Cottonwood Creek at two points as follows: (1) approximately at the South quarter corner of Section 12, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch; (2) approximately at the center of said Section 12 into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 160 acres of land owned and described as follows:

Penny, William .....	53.3 acres	in Section 10, Township 23 South, Range 5 West.
Manhard, Dennis B. ....	53.3 acres	in Section 10, Township 23 South, Range 5 West.
Mortensen, E. H. ....	53.4 acres	in Section 10, Township 23 South, Range 5 West.
Total .....	160.0 acres	

Said water to be prorated to the owners of the right to the use thereof for periods of time in proportion as their respective acreage bears to the whole acreage.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that E. H. Mortensen is entitled to the use of .50 c.f.s. of the waters of Cottonwood Creek from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year, with priority date as of 1890. Said water to be diverted from Cottonwood Creek at a point in the Northeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 12, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used to irrigate 20.0 acres of land embraced in Section 10, Township 23 South, Range 5 West. Also a supplemental right from April 1 to October 15 in each and every year of the waters of Oak Spring, with priority date as of 1890. Said water to be diverted from Oak Spring at a point in the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 12, Township 23 South, Range 5 West, into an unnamed ditch and used as a supplemental supply to irrigate the 20.0 acres of land above described. Also a right to the use of .50 c.f.s. during the non-irrigation season, with priority date as of 1890, for stock watering purposes. Said water to be diverted as above described and used for domestic purposes and for stock watering purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Kanosh Indians, a tribe of Ute Indians located near Kanosh in Millard County, Utah, are entitled to the use of all of the waters of Oak Spring and Little Cottonwood Creek under application filed in the office of the State Engineer of the State of Utah, No. 11277, with priority date as stated in said application, for stock watering and domestic uses and for the irrigation of land located in Township 23 South, Range 5 West, more fully des-
