

low the impounding dam of the Gunnison Bend Reservoir, commonly known as the Craft right, and decreed to D. Crafts, et al, in that certain decree rendered in the District Court of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Utah and for the County of Millard in the year 1902, in that certain action entitled "D. Crafts, et al, vs. Owen Conk, et al", and reaffirmed by a decree of said court in the year 1919 in that certain action entitled "Millard County Land & Water Company vs. Abraham Irrigation Company, et al", has been lost, forfeited and abandoned in its entirety, and that none of the water claimed under said right has been used on the land to which it was appurtenant, or at all, since the year 1922.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that as to serial No. 669, commonly known as the Albert Hales right, which was initiated in 1877, and was used on a part of Section 10 in Township 18 South, Range 9 West, in Millard County, Utah; and that in 1920, 1921, 1922, and 1923 the said land was rendered valueless because of the dumping of drain water on it, that since said time the water claimed under said right has not been beneficially used on said land or any part of the same, or at all, and that the owner and owners of the said right have lost, forfeited and abandoned the same, and have no right whatever to the use of the said water or any part thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that all of the waters of Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries flowing in the mountains East of Oak City in Millard County, Utah, and the use of the same for irrigation, domestic and culinary purposes, be, and the same is hereby, allocated and decreed as follows: To the Oak Creek Irrigation Company, a Utah Corporation of Oak City, Millard County, Utah, a first and prior right to the use of all of the waters flowing in said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year up to and including a flow of 55.40 cubic feet of water per second of time, with priority date as of 1870. All of the waters flowing in said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries from January 1 to December 31 in each and every year in excess of 55.40 cubic ft. of water per second of time is allocated, awarded and decreed to J. Lee Anderson 1/8th, George H. Anderson 1/8th, Eldon Anderson 1/8th, Don L. Anderson 1/8th, F. Ellis Anderson 1/8th, Willard Christensen 1/8th, Albert Christensen 1/8th, and the heirs at law of the estate of Thomas E. Talbot, deceased, jointly 1/8th.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the said Oak Creek Irrigation Company be, and it is hereby, prohibited and enjoined from diverting any of the waters of said streams and/or their tributaries at a point on Oak Creek above the present points of diversion of the said Oak Creek Irrigation Company, and that each and all of the parties entitled to the use of the waters from said Oak Creek and Dry Creek and their tributaries be enjoined and restrained from interfering with the
