This matter coming on regularly for trial on the 19th day of April, A. D. 1928, at the Court Room of the Court House at Kanab, Kane County, Utah. J. H. Erickson appearing as Counsel for the Plaintiffs, the Defendant appearing in person and in open court stated to the Court that he did not wish to proceed upon his Answer filed herein and agreed and stipulated in open Court that he claimed no rights to the use of said waters as against the Plaintiffs' rights and did not wish to contest the same. And after hearing the evidence both oral and documentary on part of the Plaintiffs, the Court also having made its Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law which are entered herein and the Court being fully advised in the premises now upon motion of J. H. Erickson, it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED¹ That plaintiffs' rights to the use of said Johnson Creek as pleaded in their said Complaint is hereby conferred and adjudged to be good and valid.

11. It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that at the time the said Defendant Oscar A. Robinson, To-wit: on the 5th day of February, A. D. 1928, made his application to the State Engineer of the State of Utah to appropriate 480 acre feet of the waters of Johnson Creek, which application is numbered 9239, that there was no surplus and un-
