

provision subject to correction or revision as provided in the next succeeding provision.

14. That this matter shall be continued until April 12th, 1954, for the purpose of revising, continuing in force, or otherwise determining, the following temporary schedule with the end in view that during the irrigation season of 1953, the parties and the Water Commissioner can make observation and calculation with regard to the operation of the schedule hereinafter set out for the purpose of determining whether it reasonably effectuates the rights of the parties to equitably share in said water supply, subject to the conditions stated in Award No. 60, and with a view of permitting the court during the 1954 season or during any subsequent season to which this matter may be continued by revised schedules or other plan, to compensate for any inequality and to carry out the basic principles of Award No. 60 as herein found. It is further provided that this provision shall be interlocutory for a period of five years during which time the court shall reserve jurisdiction to further continue this phase of the case as deemed necessary in order to permit temporary provision from year to year for the purposes stated and during which time any party at such continued date or upon notice may introduce further evidence; that until the continued date above specified or until the court otherwise orders, the following schedule shall apply on the division of the water of South Creek, including Birch Creek and Twist Creek, between the Yardleys and the lower users:

From the beginning of the irrigation season until May 15th, 1953, Yardleys to have a constant flow of $54/461$, and the lower users to have $407/461$; from May 16th to June 15th, Yardleys to have $2/9$ of the stream for four days out of each ten-day period, and permit the entire flow to pass on to the lower users during the next six days
