That plaintiff is also the owner of that certain reservoir, the lower

or main dam of which is situated in the Northeast Quarter of Section 19, Township 14 South of Range 22 East, and of large canals and other structures and distributing laterals, with capacity to carry and distribute the water stored and to be stored in said reservoir; that said canals of plaintiff, divert the water from said Goose Creek within approximately one-half mile below said dam, and said water now is and for many years last past has been, used for irrigating and reclaiming large tracts of arid land in townships 12, 13 and 14 South of Ranges 20 21 and 22, East, B.M., Cassia County, Idaho, and said plaintiff is entitled to divert the waters of Goose Creek and its tributaries into its said reservoir and canals and laterals under the appropriations, permits, rights and priorities hereinbefore set forth, and to the amount hereinbefore specified under each of said rights, permits and priorities, subject to such rights as are hereinafter decreed to defendants.
