

9. The State Engineer, or his duly appointed water commissioner, may authorize temporary changes when conditions merit such changes without notice or upon such notice and upon such conditions as the State Engineer shall determine.

10. Such headgates, diversion and measuring devices must be installed as directed by the State Engineer and such maintenance of both the natural channel and diversion canals should be effected as directed by the State Engineer.

11. It is recommended that the rights to the use of water within the area included in this proposed determination be decreed to the various parties substantially as set forth herein. It is further recommended that the Court require that the State Engineer, at periodic intervals of not less than five years, make his report to the Court for inclusion in a supplemental order or decree, said report to include adjustments, corrections of names of owners and of their addresses, action taken on pending applications, and such other matters as time may indicate to the Court to be just and proper.

12. In all matters whatsoever pertaining to this proposed determination of water rights, the services and assistance and advice of the office of the State Engineer are and shall remain available to the Court.
