

What is a General Stream Adjudication?

What it IS...

- Action in State District Court
- Joins and binds all water users and the State Engineer (Division of Water Rights)
- Governed by Utah State Code: Title 73,
 Chapter 4
- To determine the nature and extent of all existing water rights within each river drainage





What is a Water Right?

A **water right** is a right to divert and beneficially use water. The defining elements of a typical water right will include:

- A defined nature of beneficial use
- A priority date
- A defined *quantity* of water allowed for diversion by flow rate (cfs) and/or by volume (acre-feet)
- A specified *point of diversion* and source of water
- A specified place of beneficial use

Typical Examples:

- Underground Well
- Irrigation ditches or headgates.



Why Do We Conduct General Adjudications?

- Bring all claims on to the permanent record:
 - Pre-Statutory Claims
 - Diligence Claims (1903)
 - Underground Water Claims (1935)

Article 17: All existing rights to the use of any of the waters in this State for any useful or beneficial purpose, are hereby recognized and confirmed

- Federal Reserve Rights
 - Winter's Doctrine (1908)
 - McCarran Amendment (1952)
- To prevent a "multiplicity of suits" and bring clarity to the water rights picture.
- Remove/reduce rights which have been wholly or partially forfeited through non-use.



 To obtain final comprehensive decrees on all water rights within the respective drainage.

Navajo Nation Water Right Settlement

- Historical Timeline:
 - Negotiation began in 2003
 - Agreement reached in 2015
 - Federal ratification in Dec 2020
 - State ratification in 2021 session
 - SB225 (2021)
 - SJR014 (2021)

Agreement Details

- 435 cfs; 81,500 acre-feet of depletion
 - Block 1 69,275 acre-feet May 17, 1884 priority date
 - Block 2 4,480 acre-feet May 15, 1905 priority date
 - Block 3 3,670 acre-feet March 1, 1933 priority date
 - Block 4 4,075 acre-feet September 2, 1958 priority date
- Funding for water development projects in the "Utah portion" of the Navajo Nation.
 - State of Utah: \$8 million
 - United States: over \$200 million




Agreement Benefits

- Clean Drinking Water Projects for Navajo Nation
- Avoids Costly Litigation and Uncertain Outcomes
- Removes a Significant Unknown from Colorado River System
- Establishes a Partnership with the Navajo Nation on the Colorado River
- Protects Existing State-Based Water Rights






Navajo Nation Subdivision Adjudication Boundary




Southeastern Colorado River Adjudication Progress







































Phase 1: Summons and Notice to File Claims











• The summons is mailed to water right owners and property owners. It is also published in the local newspaper.



 An initial public meeting is held to inform water users of the adjudication process.



• The notice to file claims is given. Claimants have 90 days to file a *Water Users Claim*. A claimant that does not participate may be prevented from asserting a claim in the future.

- The water user must complete and file a
 Water User's Claim with the State
 Engineer or the District Court for each
 water right.
- Due to complexity of defining water rights, Adjudication staff may help the water user in completing the claim.
- State Engineer files the claim with the Court on behalf of the water user as a courtesy.
- Claims are only required on perfected rights (i.e., certificated rights, decreed rights, and diligence claims). All entities (including individuals, companies, and municipalities) that own a water right in the adjudication area should file.

Phase 2: List of Unclaimed Rights and Final Summons












- Any known rights not claimed are published on the List of Unclaimed Rights which is published with the court. Notice is also given to all claimants. Any dissatisfied party may object within 90 days.
- A second public meeting is held to discuss the List of Unclaimed Rights and how to file an objection.
- The State Engineer makes a final search for potential claimants and publishes a final summons.
- Objections to the List of Unclaimed Rights are resolved and the court renders a decree.



Phase 3: Proposed Determination and Final Decree














- Division staff evaluates and maps the claims. A State Engineer's Recommendation (SER) is prepared.
- The Proposed Determination represents the State Engineer's recommendation to the court for each water right.
- Any dissatisfied party may object within 90 days.

- A final public meeting is held to discuss the Proposed Determination and how to file an objection.
- Objections to the Proposed Determination are resolved and the court renders a decree.










Quick Answers

- Q: What water development projects are planned?
 - A: The Navajo Nation is evaluating which projects to pursue.
- Q: I didn't receive a summons. Was I missed?
 - A: Due to the unique status of the Navajo Nation, a relatively small group of parties received summons. The summons of the federal government addresses all existing Navajo Nation uses.





Quick Answers

- Q: I am a Navajo Nation member. What is my responsibility in the adjudication?
 - A: Unless you own a state-based water right, the Dept. of Interior and the Navajo Nation will represent you in the adjudication.
- Q: I own water rights in (Bluff/Blanding/Monticello). What is my responsibility in this adjudication?
 - A: Unless you own a state-based water right within the adjudication boundary, you do not need to file a water user's claim at this time.



Quick Answers

- Q: I own a water right outside of the Navajo Nation adjudication boundary. What should I do to prepare?
 - A1: Return unused or underused rights to use.
 - A2: Make sure water right title is current.
- Q: Will I lose my water right?
 - A1: Navajo Nation water rights are not subject to forfeiture.
 - A2: Only water rights within the adjudication boundary are
 presently being adjudicated.
