
We appreciate your concern regarding our underground water supply. The meeting in Tooele Thursday morning (24 April 2008) was well attended and worthwhile and the information was well presented. Your geological model described quite well the fears that many of us have had these past several years as we have seen more and more wells drilled and water rights transferred to East Erda. Your presentation described very well our current and future dilemmas. Realizing it is only a mathematical model, still it is the best analytical tool we have, and we must either discard it or believe it. If we believe it, we are duty-bound to act responsibly and carry out those actions necessary to correct our current water problems as described by the model for Tooele valley. As you will note from the many signatures appearing below, the great majority of us in this area agree that this action must be taken, and taken very soon. Below is a numbered list of our recommended actions:

1. Issue an immediate moratorium on all new well permits.
2. Disapprove any and all requests to transfer water rights to points east of their current location. Of course, some allowance must be made for legitimate requests from people who need to replace an existing water source, but only if the new location is on the same property parcel and the new permit is for only the amount of water that has been "proved up" at the old location.
3. Modify your suggested approval zone of four miles. It is way excessive. One mile would be more than adequate to accommodate legitimate requests as suggested above.
4. Take into account the quality of water in the old location of an existing permit as you consider requests for transfers to locations where the water is of higher quality.
5. Become aware of any water transfer from Tooele valley to Salt Lake valley, particularly by Kennecott Copper. We don't believe that our wells and springs should be diminished in capacity just to provide water for developers in other areas of the state.

We hope you noted the potential threat of litigation from the gentleman in the meeting seated on the front row to your right. We hope you will be more dedicated to the common good than what was reported a few years ago about some county officials: Avoid litigation at all costs — give them whatever they want to avoid a law suit.

Again, we appreciate the work you are doing and hope you can create a policy that will eventually get us out of this desert-creating condition that we are now facing.
